As VCAM has made it a priority to increase awareness in the community of the services that are provided, the total numbers served has seen a rapidly rising increase. It is great that the awareness is up, but a somber indication that more are in need of assistance. And VCAM is in need of assistance.

Help us raise awareness and raise donations to fill our shelves. Our cupboards are bare! Okay, maybe not our cupboards, but our pantry shelves are emptying as fast as we can fill them.

VCAM *does not* provide financial assistance w/ electricity bills, but *does* provide assistance w/ payment of past due water or natural gas bills (financial limits apply). And although VCAM at its current address is busting at the seams on the busiest of days of operation, we are *not* seeking a second location.

One last thing: **Raffle Ticket Fundraiser ticket sales have begun!** VCAM board members will be at various locations in the next month, selling tickets for our only fundraiser of the year. Thank you for your generous gift of quilts and kits for LWR's distribution overseas. These gifts of your hearts and hands are beautiful expressions of God's grace and love to people all around the world.

Because of your support, LWR is able to share the tangible love of Christ with thousands of people through your quilts and kits. Last year, LWR and partners Children's Gift Ministry (CGM) and OLAM were busy distributing School Kits in Honduras, to children whose families are vulnerable due to lack of access to the most basic necessities. Parents often have to choose between feeding their children and sending them to school. School Kits were distributed to more than 28,000 Honduran children to help them get back to or stay in school, increasing their chances of breaking the chains of chronic poverty and avoiding the very real risk of gang involvement. 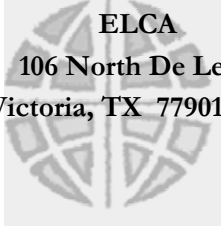
